



### **Filling Out the “Proposed Course of Study Form”**

This form is used for the creation of a provisional schedule for a new student. There will be many opportunities before classes start to make adjustments to the provisional schedule. Fill out the form to the best of your abilities - nothing is written in stone!

- Students at Walnut Hill typically take four courses, or for students in the Music Department, five, including music theory.
- The maximum course load for a Walnut Hill student is six courses.
- Do not sign up for more than six courses.

### **Spanish, French and Music Theory**

Placement tests are available for Spanish, French and music theory courses.

- The Spanish and French written placement tests are available through [www.walnuthillarts.org](http://www.walnuthillarts.org) and an oral placement test will be given during Orientation.
- Sign up for the course you think you will place into (ex: if you have just completed Spanish I, sign up for Spanish II) – but your placement may be different after the tests.
- Music Theory placement tests are given when students arrive on campus in the fall.

### **Math**

Please complete and return the form asking for information about previous math courses included in the registration packet. On the proposed course of study form, sign up for the course that would be next in your math sequence.

- If you have last completed Pre-algebra, sign up for Algebra I
- If you have last completed Algebra I, sign up for Geometry
- If you have last completed Geometry, sign up for Introduction to Algebra II

***For the following courses, there will be time during Orientation and the first few days of classes to ensure of correct class placement.***

- If you have last completed Algebra II, sign up for either Advanced Algebra II or Precalculus
- If you have last completed Precalculus, sign up for Accelerated Calculus or Calculus.

### **English, History and Science**

All students must take English each year. Sign up for the English course appropriate for your grade. Students must take two history courses, including US History, for graduation, and two lab sciences. Course credit from a previous high school counts towards the requirement. You are welcome to take more than two credits of History or Science as elective courses, but you are not required to do so. Most Walnut Hill students do not take four years of history or science.
